As Department Head, this administrator coordinates the academic and scholarly activities of approximately 50 faculty members who have appointments in the Department of Youth Development. The Department Head assures adherence to knowledge-based practice in the conduct of youth development programming and fosters the continued professional development of all faculty with department appointments. This administrator oversees an annual budget of more than \$5.0 million and provides programmatic oversight to Oregon 4-H Foundation. The Foundation has a current endowment balance more than \$6 million and annual revenues of approximately \$2 million.
