Reminder: Enrollment Window for Summer Tuition Assistance Includes New Requirements

New for summer 2021, applications will be required for faculty and staff tuition assistance. The enrollment window for summer semester 2021 is March 22 to May 14. Eligible faculty and staff can apply in Workday or with paper forms. Applications for dependent tuition assistance must be submitted each term. Starting summer 2021, both parents will be required to enroll in dependent tuition assistance to qualify for the 75% benefit. CFAES Wooster Campus Analog Phone System Retirement

Along with the Columbus campus university analog phone system retirement, OCIO will also be completing the CFAES Wooster campus analog phone system retirement within the next 90 days. Standard telephone users have all moved to the new telecommunication platform Skype for Business. If you are only responsible for your own phone and have already moved to Skype for Business, no further action is required. However, remaining analog lines will be handled in one of following ways:

Removed from service – no longer needed / out-of-date

- Moved to Skype for Business phones using extension(s) numbers will get new numbers
- Moved to new Digital Fax Service
- Keep analog for specialized equipment only SensaPhones, Argus Systems, Viking Devices, minus 80 Freezers that dial out, etc.

Any analog lines remaining & not resolved from the above work by April 30th will be removed in preparation to retire the legacy in May. President's Research Excellence Program Now Accepting Proposals

The President's Research Excellence (PRE) program is officially accepting proposals designed to seed support for cross disciplinary and interdisciplinary research that will attract external funding. PRE is specifically looking to fund two distinct proposal types:

- Accelerator proposals for small teams formed to pursue curiosity-driven, novel, high-risk and high-reward research. The grants may be up to \$50,000.
- Catalyst proposals for interdisciplinary teams to pursue large-scale, high-impact research that addresses emerging or existing challenges of national and international societal importance while generating long-term, sustained, impact, which positions Ohio State as THE leader in this area. These grants may be up to \$200,000.
