Tuition Assistance Enrollment Opens Soon

Applications for <u>tuition assistance benefits</u> must be submitted each term and the enrollment window for spring semester 2022 is Nov. 23 to Jan. 14. Eligible faculty and staff can apply in <u>Workday</u> (recommended) or with paper forms for <u>dependent tuition assistance</u> and <u>faculty and staff tuition assistance</u>. To receive dependent tuition assistance, the student must have a Social Security number on file with their university student record. To add a Social Security number, use the <u>change of record form</u> on the <u>Registrar's website</u>. Read more.

Next Round of Workstation Updates Begin 11/19

The next round of software updates is now available to install for OCIO-managed workstations via Software Center (for Windows PC) or Ohio State Application Self Service (for Mac). The IT Service Desk will remotely deploy these on Friday, November 19 which will require you to restart your machine and/or close applications. To make these updates at your convenience prior to Friday via your appropriate software update application and avoid interruptions that could occur from an automatic update:

- For Windows PCs
- For Macs

Windows PC users will begin receiving prompts to reboot on Friday, November 19 if your device is turned on and you are logged in. Windows users can delay the reboot for up to 24 hours. Mac users begin receiving prompts to reboot on Tuesday, November 16, and can delay reboot until receiving a final notification on Friday, November 19. At that time, you will have 60 minutes to reboot.

Timelines can change depending on when you turn on and log in to your device.

We will also be deploying Crowdstrike Falcon only to OCIO-managed Macs, a new component of our endpoint protection tool. We will also be removing the current antivirus software Microsoft Defender for Endpoints (MDE). You may notice some different icons following the normal monthly reboot(s).

Unused Compensatory Time to Be Paid Beginning In 2022

Unused compensatory time will be paid out starting in 2022 per the previously revised Scheduling Work and Overtime Compensation Policy 6.10. Any earned compensatory time not used within 365 days will be paid out on a regular paycheck. Compensatory payouts will begin with biweekly paychecks on Feb. 11 and continue with each pay period, as applicable. Read more.
