

Comments at Opening Session Wooster Campus Strategic Planning

Today, we need all of you to put forward your best ideas related to the three missions of the college. We are a cornerstone college, being one of the first colleges within Ohio

State University, I know that our Dean wants this campus to grow, to continue to be a source of excellence in research, teaching and outreach. We have unique resources and skillsets that complement others within the college and we need to take advantage of these strengths.
