Plan a Mental Health Check-in

Schedule a time to check in with your team. Use this time to connect, share resources or funny stories and don't talk about work.

Incorporate a Mindfulness Moment to Open Meetings

Start your meetings with 5 minutes of mindful activity together. Encourage others to understand mindfulness and use it as a strategy. <u>Learn how mindfulness can help</u>.

Challenge your Team to End Meetings Early

End your Zoom meetings 5-15 minutes early to get up, move around, get a drink or take care of something non-work related that is bothering you and needs to be completed.

Perform Meetings Standing Up or Walking

Standing up or walking during meetings promotes productivity, shorter meetings and less screen time. If you used to have walking meetings in person, try

dropping Zoom and completing them on the phone.

Take a Minute to Stretch

Try incorporating <u>stretches</u> into the beginning/end of your meetings. Stretching can positively impact your work by increasing productivity, and your health by relieving stress and revitalizing your mind.

Ohio State Compost Drop-off Program

The KNOW Food Waste Team in partnership with Ohio State's Zero Waste team at Facilities Operations and Development (FOD), is launching the **Ohio State Compost Drop-Off Program** to support Ohio State's resource stewardship goal of achieving zero waste by 2025 by diverting 90% of waste away from landfills. The goal of this program is to provide Buckeyes easy access to compost food waste generated at home and drop it off on campus at a subsidized rate. As a program participant, you will be provided with a bucket and compostable liners to collect your household compostable waste, which can then be dropped off at FOD's drop-off site at 2560 Kenny Rd. on campus on any day of the week. Standard telephone users have all moved to the new telecommunication platform Skype for Business. If you are only responsible for your own phone and have already moved to Skype for Business, no further action is required. However, remaining analog lines will be handled in one of following ways:

- Removed from service no longer needed / out-of-date
- Moved to Skype for Business phones using extension(s) numbers will get new numbers
- Moved to new Digital Fax Service
- Keep analog for specialized equipment only SensaPhones,
 Argus Systems, Viking Devices, minus 80 Freezers that dial out, etc.

Any analog lines remaining & not resolved from the above work by **April 30th** will be removed in preparation to retire the legacy in May. If you believe you have an existing analog phone line that has been missed, please contact OCIO
