### **Have a Food Safe Summer!**

The warmer weather conditions may be ideal for outdoor grilling and picnics, but make sure you are food safe during the hot summer months so your fun in the sun does not get cut short!

- When grilling, do not use the same plate for the raw meat and cooked meat...use separate plates to keep from cross contaminating foods.
- Wash all produce under running water before eating, cutting or cooking... even if you plan to peel them!
- Be mindful about food temperatures (Keep COLD foods COLD and HOT foods HOT!). For example, potato salad should be kept cold...so put those picnic perishable foods in an insulated cooler packed with ice. And never leave food out for longer than two hours (1 hour if 90 degrees or above).
